



ALL SAINTS' DAY CELEBRATION

All Saints' Day occurs on November 1st, but our celebration will be during worship on November 6th. Here at First Presbyterian of Homewood, we remember those saints who have died in the past year since last November 1st on All Saints' Sunday. *"All Saints' Day is a time to rejoice in all who through the ages have faithfully served the Lord. The day reminds us that we are part of one continuing, living communion of saints. ...It is a time to express our gratitude for all whom in ages of darkness kept the faith, for those who have taken the gospel to the ends of the earth, for prophetic voices who have called the church to be faithful in life and service, for all who have witnessed to God's justice and peace in every nation.*

"To rejoice with all the faithful of every generation expands our awareness of a great company of witnesses above and around us like a cloud (Hebrews 12:1). It lifts us out of a preoccupation with our own immediate situation and the discouragements of the present. In the knowledge that others have persevered, we are encouraged to endure against all odds (Hebrews 12:1-2). Reminded that God was with the faithful of the past, we are reassured that God is with us today, moving us and all creation toward God's end in time. [To this end, we] commemorate the lives of those who died during the previous year."

The topic of a joint choir with Calvary Church was discussed. No decision was made.



TRUSTEE REPORT

At the October 11th meeting of the Trustees, Building & Grounds Committee reported that some of the gutter leaks have been fixed, but the gutter in front of the elevator is still leaking. It was a good Whole Church Work Day on October 8. Thanks to the 15 people who came out to participate—7 in the kitchen and 8 outdoors. The kitchen looks great, but the cabinets inside and the coffee pots still need cleaning. The kitchen exhaust fan needs cleaning, but the cleaning is on hold until the circuit breaker can be located. The piano is scheduled for tuning on October 12. In January, the elevator will be due for the state required pressure test, an expensive project. From the office liaison, it was discovered that ink and paper for the copier are reordered automatically by the machine! There are no problems with the phones under the new contract with Comcast. However, when AT&T removed its lines, it also cut off the electricity to the garage. Risk Prevention hopes to solve the wobbling railing outside the C.E. building south entrance and to fix the concrete at the main entrance door. Church Mutual (our insurance carrier) will be sending new sensors for water leaks and for freezing pipes, an update. The Stewardship Team filled two vacancies with Jim Foster and Sylvia Tufts taking on Memorial Gift acknowledge-

ments and Doug Bonthron becoming a new signer of checks. Jan Wahl was thanked for her service on the Board of Trustees as she transfers to Tennessee.

The wild turkey can fly! (It does, however, prefer to walk or run.) The domestic turkey is not an agile flyer, although the bird will perch in trees to stay safe from predators.

OUTREACH MINISTRY

First Presbyterian of Homewood is invited to join Calvary Church of Park Forest in Outreach Ministry during November. Part I of Calvary's outreach with coats for ANEW is completed, but Part II with coats for the Village of Park Forest is on-going.

FPCHW members have two choices:

- 1) If members prefer *not* to go shopping themselves, they could write a check payable to Calvary and put it in a sealed envelope and put it in the office mailbox of Melodee Leimnetzer at FPCHW. (The cost of coats runs between \$35 and \$50.) Calvary will then buy the coats that are needed.
- 2) If members prefer to shop themselves, the coats that will be needed should be from the ages of infant to high school (some teens need XL coats for boys and girls). The coats with *price tags* still attached should be *unwrapped* and brought forward to the front of the church during the offering on *each* Sunday during the month of *November*. The coats will then be locked up in Pastor Matt's office.

The birds were domesticated in Europe and later brought to North America by English colonists. Note that domesticated turkeys have white-tipped tails; wild turkeys have dark-tipped tails.

Why do turkeys gobble?

Only male turkeys can make a call known as a "gobble," and they mostly do it in the spring and fall. It is a mating call and attracts the hens. Wild turkeys gobble when they're surprised by loud sounds and when they settle in for the night. The wild turkey can make at least 30 different calls!

For a great new life to come.


